OUR VIBRANT NEIGHBORS

By Sue Fuller

Only eight houses existed on the west side of Woodland Street when Mr. and Mrs. Melancthon Jacobus built their family home in 1908. Designed by architect William C. Brocklesby, this Tudor Revival Style house at #39 is

well worth a walk across the street to admire. Study its first story of brick, its upper stories of half-timber and stucco, its contrasting stone sills, its gables and leaded glass, and its marvelous molded chimneys. Then try to picture the life of the three small Jacobus children who lived, played and were schooled there. Professor Jacobus, a dean at Hartford Seminary, was married at forty to Miss Clarissa

Smith Cooley, youngest daughter of a prominent Hartford family, and this was their residence for thirty years. Mrs. Jacobus was a founding member of the Town and County Club, and their son, Melancthon III, known to his friends as Chick, was a popular teacher at the then Kingswood School. After retirement, he was a valuable addition to the staff of the Connecticut Historical Society, and was the source of most of the information on record about life in this splendid house.

Built at a cost of \$48,000, the house was sold in 1939 to the University of Connecticut College of Insurance for \$25,000. With a large addition to its rear, it subsequently became the UConn Law Library. After extensive renovations, covering a nine-year period, the Connecticut State

University Office relocated here in June of 1991.

The Connecticut State University System (CSU) consists of four universities: Central in New Britain, Eastern in Willimantic, Southern in New Haven, Western in Danbury, and a system office. It serves 33,000 students. The combined universities offer 130 academic programs and annually award more than 5,000 degrees to students of all ages.

On Woodland Street, the office of the Chancellor, who represents the CSU System to all state government agencies including the General Assembly, is housed in the former Jacobus living room. The State of Connecticut has invested in a seventeen million dollar state-of-the-art telecommunication infrastructure

The Board of Trustees now meets around a large table in the mahogany paneled dining room where a secret panel still can be opened to

reveal the silver safe the architect cleverly concealed. Though rooms on every floor of the house have been subdivided to make offices, the beautiful gum woodwork and seven fireplaces have all been preserved. Now listed on the National Historic Register, this is a fine example of an early 20th century house converted with great respect to a bustling 21st century workplace for approximately seventy people.
